



Students are more likely to be successful academically if they feel secure in their school environment. All students must be valued alike.

### **Key Stage 3, 4 and 5**

### **Form teacher**

All pupils are placed in a form group of approximately 30 pupils. The form teacher will take responsibility for providing pastoral support and guidance to ensure the welfare of members of the form group on a day to day basis.

### **Deputy Heads of School**

Responsible for a particular year group and the promote high standards amongst pupil including behaviour and uniform. They work closely with Form teachers and school Heads to identify pupil concerns (pastoral, academic and behavioural) and provide necessary support and intervention to ensure that pupils progress well at school.

### **Heads of School**

Heads of school oversee a particular Key Stage as well as taking responsibility for a year group. They work with Deputy Heads of School to monitor pupil progress and identify pupil concerns providing the necessary support and intervention when required.

## **Religious Education and Moral Education**

Offers Counselling support to pupils, staff and parents

## **Citizenship Lessons**

Aimed at developing a full understanding of their roles and responsibilities as citizens in the wider community. The topics include current affairs, Global Issues and political participation etc

## **Career Guidance to Key Stages IV and V**

### **Education for Personal Relationship (EPR)**

Lesson delivered by Form teachers, and where appropriate, by visiting speakers. All pupils get EPR lessons, each work during their morning form period. Topics include Healthy Living, Bullying, Disability Awareness and Independent Living.

### **Aim Higher**

It is a scheme which triggers the children to set very high ambitions about their academic success. This is done through proper counseling, career guidance etc.
